Final Written Examination 2020

Examination Format:

The Saudi subspecialty fellowship and diplomas final written examination shall consist of one paper with 80-120 multiple-choice questions (single best answer out of four options). 10 unscored items can be added for pretesting purposes.

Passing Score:

The passing score is 70%. However, if the percentage of candidates passing the examination before final approval is less than 70%, the passing score must be lowered by one mark at a time aiming at achieving 70% passing rate or 65% passing score whichever comes first. Under no circumstances can the passing score be reduced below 65%.

EXAMPLE OF K2 QUESTIONS

Question 1

A 50-year-old man came to the dental clinic complaining of discomfort related to the upper right quadrant. Patient reported having an implant done for him 10 years ago. Patient does not attend regular follow-up appointments for that implant. Examination revealed an implant in the area of 16 with marked gingival erythema, attachment loss exposing 5 mm of the implant threads and marked mobility.

Which of the following is the most appropriate treatment?

- A. Explantation
- B. Nonsurgical treatment
- C. Surgical treatment with autogenous bone graft and membrane
- D. Remove the implant crown to decrease the load on the implant

Which of the following best describes a patient that suffers from bruxism?

- A. High risk for implant therapy
- B. Very Low risk for implant therapy
- C. Good candidate for implant treatment
- D. Low risk if the patient has wearing facets
